

Treasurers Report for Year ended 30 June 1996

I hereby submit the MG Car Club of Qld Inc. accounts for the year July 1995 through June 1996.

The 1995 / 96 financial year has shown a small improvement over 1994 / 95. The operating profit has risen from \$29864 in 1994/95 to \$35862 in 1995/96.

Income has decreased from \$47692 in 1994/95 to \$46090 in 1995/96. This is mainly due to the decrease in profits from canteen trading, however we have also seen an increase in our investment interest and small increases in event and subscription income.

The Canteen profits are reduced as the club did not cater for the Macleans Bridge display on Mothers Day as we have in previous years. Also we have been unfortunate enough to have a number of wet hillclimbs which I believe have reduced canteen profits. One last factor effecting the canteen figures was the purchase of a gas urn which has both improved the service we can give to the canteen customers and helps the canteen staff when cleaning up, etc.

Regalia profits are also down on last year. Comparing 1994/95 with this year the income was similar however we invested in new grill badges which we expect to be very popular.

Expenses in 1995/96 have reduced considerably over 1993/94. The major reduction is that we are not not currently paying rental for clubrooms, however printing costs have escalated as we do not have the use of our own photocopier. It should be noted that we also did not have any copier repair expenses.

Because of the difficulties of being without clubrooms the Club has subsidised a number of social events which is reflected in the increase in social expenses.

It is also worth mentioning that the \$4000 loan has now been repaid.

In conclusion I would like to thank those that have worked for the Club throughout the last 12 months and would encourage others to step forward and lend a hand when possible.

The MG Midget was chosen as the Club's representative and joined the Porsche 928, Triumph TR 4 and the Mazda MX-5 for the overall judging.



LEYBURN

AUGUST 1942 The lost silence fo a cold winter's night is shattered by the roar of four mighty Z Force Liberator engines. They strain to lift the 30 ton warbird into the star studded sky above the little Darling Downs town of Leyburn. 30 seconds later the blissful silence returns. The black silhouette slips away on its clandestine activity.

18TH SEPTEMBER 1949 The tranquil country atmosphere of Leyburn is shatter once again by the snarl and crackle of stressed engines. The Australian Grand Prix arrived for the first time in Queensland. Almost 30,000 spectators witnessed the sound and excitement. The exotic MG., Delahaye, Jaguar, Riley and Lea Francis did battle with the Aussie specials-Hudson V8, Flat Head Ford, Buick, Cadillac, Dodge. The clever engineering of the Australian special builders was no match for John Crouch and his French Delahaye. John won by a comfortable 4min. 35 sec..


The Leyburn circuit remained in favour with the weekend racers for a few year in the early 50's. Stories abound retold over and over in favourite watering holes. Like the story of the day the 3 Ford Customlines raced. Plenty of power, little breaking and suspension. All 3 cars started the day complete automobiles. By race end, none of them had their windscreens intact. So bad were the flying stones that abounded at the circuit. Motor racing moved on into the 60-70 and 80's. Leyburn returned to a more peaceful farming community.

24TH AUGUST 1996 The staccato sound from the exhaust of Joe Wilson's Super Aero Morgan blasts the Leyburn air heralding the return of racing engines at "The Historic Leyburn Sprints". The crescendo increases. J.K., the starter, counts down the time. Joe pops the clutch, wheels bite the bitumen. The Morgan is on its way. Racing is on! 181 entrants from all over south east Queensland gathered to celebrate The Historic Leyburn Sprints. A weekend so full of motoring colour and excitement, the memories will live for a very long time.

Reading through the quality entry list gives any motoring enthusiast gooses bumps. My favourite selection of cars were:-The Morgan 3 wheelers. The sound and driver's position are an incredible combination of noise and action. Chippie, the covery boy racer in his S.C. Austin 7 Special. Will that partnership ever grow old? Roger Ealand, s Alvis Speed 25 Special simply made my right foot twitch looking at it in the pits. It even smelt right before he started!! The Centaur Gt car , the epitome of the great Aussie racing specials. Geoff Sakzewski in the Dodge Phoenix - How to get it all crossed up in the back streets of Leyburn. Can he do it again next year? The sound and fury of the 6 litre Ford Mustangs. There is no substitute for cubic inches. Masses of M.G.'s and Austin Healy's, the cars that bought so much joy to so many motoring sports men and women. The Sheer British dignity of the Aston Martins and "E"type Jaguars. The explosive passion fo the Italian Ferrari, 365. GT4, 400, and F355 and Alfa Romeo Monteral and GTV. My own favourite, my Nota built KM 200. The most honest little racing car I have ever owned. It continues to play an important role in the Croston household.

A big thank you to the citizens of Leyburn for being so open and helpful in this project. To the boys in the Historic Racing Car Club (Qld) Inc. for taking the risk. To John Jones and his team for the unfailing work they put into the event.

If you didn't go, Then put it in your diary for next year. It's a must!



The Leyburn around the houses sprint circuit is roughly like a U with a little tail. The tail being the start. I was fortunate enough to view the circuit on Friday afternoon while helping John Kingott set up the timing. It is typical country town streets. Narrow, by city standard, bitumen strip with lush grass verges. The exit of turn one has a rather deceptive spoon drain a little to the left. Mental note. "Keep the exit tidy"! The breaking areas for the two left handers, turns 2 & 3 are covered with loose stones. Attention would be required to ensure the car, s best breaking performance. After turn 3 it is a matter of maximum acceleration up the slight hill to the finish.

So in 43 seconds it went something like this:-

At the end of John's count down, Pull 3000 RPM, slip your foot off the clutch, feed in the power quickly. Don't break traction. 7000 RPM hold it for 1/10 of a second. Off power turn right, on power, keep it tight. Don't drop the rear wheels over the edge of the bitumen. 7000 RPM 2nd, 7000 RPM, to 3rd. Over the little hump. The scenery in a blur, only the thin line of the road matters. Breaking at about the 1 and a half markers, the car squirms on the loose surface, back to 2nd. Watch for the apex, car still battling for traction, must adjust the break bias a little more through the corner. 7000 RPM 2nd into 3rd gear for about 1 sec. Onto the down hill breaking for turn 3, back to 2nd through the apex, car snaking under brakes. Keep it tidy, get the power on quickly. Nice neat gear changes. 3rd, 7000 and top just before we cross the finish line. Switch off. Let the car roll to a standstill in the finish marshalling area. The only sounds to intrude on the driver's thoughts of how to do it in 42 secs, is the gentle flicking noise of a little loose gravel bouncing off the inner guards.
