



IRONMAN '86

This year saw the whole week-end organised and run by the M.G. Car Club of Queensland and if you entered the whole weekend there was an incentive to enter early and all 4 -a reduced entry fee. 53 entries were received to run in the 4 events of the weekend.

Friday 29th August saw the intrepid crew turn up for the Night Run at the Ipswich West Moreton Automobile Club rooms at Bundamba. Where would they go on this night run?

With a free choice of route to find several questions in Ipswichthen out thru Walloon, Marburg, back to Redbank Plains, Acacia Ridge, and back to finish at Eagers Recreation Rooms at Newstead.

When everybody was back heavy discussions as to where one went, how more went wrong - and what one should have done, took place.

Giles Cooper obviously made the right decisions, as he and David Slater came in 1st overall.

CAMS RULES CORNER

RADIO COMMUNCIATION IN COMPETITION

The National Council has amended the general requirements for cars, based on the recommendation of the Motor Racing Execuitive, and there is now no prohibition at all on radio communication between pit and service crews. As a consequence, Regulation 1.6 of part 2 of Appendix C has been amended, and now reads "not be equipped with any device providing for radio communication between the vehicle whilst in motion and pit and service crews, save in races and special stage rallies.".

RALLY CARS

The regulations for Rally Cars, at pase 338 of the 1986 Manual, will be amended from 1st January, 1987. Clause 6 will be deleted, as from that date, only Production Rally cars are eligible for the champion-ship.

COMMERCIAL FUEL

A 1985 amendment to the Manual did not find its way into the 1986 version.

Effective from March, 1985, the Regulations restricting the use of Commercial Fuel in all events have been amended, and now permit the use of alternative fuels in Formula Libre cars competing in speed events. (But not races).

CHANGE TO NCR 133

National Competition Rule 133 has been amended, and sub-paragraph (i) (b) now reads in part:
