MOTORKHANA CHAMPIONSHIP FOR QLD.

The final round of the Queensland Motorkhana Series saw the 1974 Title won by the previous champion. Phil Griffin, As in 1973 Phil dominated all rounds to comfortablely hold his crown. The event attracted quite a large field of 29, and as the Interclub was the following week, with the Australian Title a month after most were using the day as a final sorting period.

Class A was highly competitive with Phil battling for the outright lead with Hack Read, the end result not decided until the final event had been run. Phil eventually winning by 3.2 secs. As the first 3 outright places were ineligible for class awards or placings Greg Symes was rewarded for his consistency with a class win 6.6 secs ahead of Les Hastie in third place. Greg and Les will certainly upset a few of the Southerners who will be contesting the Australian Title. The other M.G. member in the class was Sprite pedler Libby Sullivan although Lib claimed a pole in the first event, she recovered from this early set back to drive her way into 14th class placing and take out the Ladies trophy. Hopes are high that Libby will be victorious for the Ladies award in the Australian Title and she will be able to give most competitors a big "hurry along".

Bruce Briggs walked away with another class victory giving all a driving lesson. His drive in the Eccentric test was truly first class as he effectively used the powerslide technique. Malcolm Spiden went all wrong in the Reverse Garage throwing away all chances of remaining with the class leaders.

Looking at the Australian Championships Phil Griffin must have an excellent opportunity to win the day. Greg Symes and Les Hastie should be thorns in the sides of many Southern competitors on their Quest for outright placings, the Ladies award should go to Libby Sullivan, Druce Briggs will certainly be a threat in the Medium wheelbase class - we will know on 8th September at Surfers Paradise.

September 8th saw the most important event on the Polebendors' calendar in the 1974 Australian Motor knana Championship. M.G. had 10 members namely:

Les Hastie (Cooper S), Greg Symes (Clubman GT)
Peter Bayment (Mini). Russell Worthington (Magda RX4)
Malcolm Spiden (Escort), Bruce Briggs (Cortina),
Libby Sullivan (Sprite), Phil Griffin (Cooper S)
Tom Hatton (Torana) and Steve Austin (MGB).

In the small wheelbase class Les Hastie and Greg Symes continued their epic duels. This time Les had the upper hand until he finished in the wrong garage dropping him from a safe third place to ninth pracing 0.1 sess behind Greg. Smoothness and consistency combined with quickness was Greg's approach to the event which enabled him to upset many local and interstate sompetitors. Considering Greg has been involved in Motorkhanas for under 12 months his effort and final result is simply remarkable.

From one of the younger to one of the cagiest drivers Black Pete. The ageless Mini had blue smoke pouring out from the wheel arches and his ginger beard. Even though Peter's competition had been limited this year he never said 'die' even when the handbrake did. Libby Sullivan was one of four lady competitors (the only Queensland representative) who were entered. As usual Lib drove the 'Club's Sprite' but unfortunately had on 'off' day as four poles fell in the first two events. Although she did pick up on her fellow competitors throughout the remaining events, the time gap was too great as she lost by 13 seconds to be the fastest lady competitor.

Of Phil Griffin - what can one say? Certainly no one tried harder than Phil on the day. The first two events were won by Dennis Tregg in his four wheel steering Renault Special (that's correct) but Phil came back by winning the next two taking the lead by 0.8 secs. Unfortunately for Phil his grip on the

title slipped away as Trigg gained 5 seconds advantage on the remaining three events.

The middle whoelbase class wan taken cut by Bursell Worthington. At half time Russell was 7 seconds behind the class leader but his performances in the latter half of the day secured the Cup for him. It was centainly his hardest fought victory and one wonders, after his incredible drive, why Russell had not contested the Queensland Series.

As always the Bruce Briggs/Malcolm Spiden Ford battle produced some tyre chucking, teeth gritting, no holds barred performances. Bruce had the Ford trophy sewn up by 2 seconds until the Reverse Garage test proved his downfall and Malcolm won the trophy by the barest margin.

Tom Hatton was debuting his Torana but unfortunately found the handbrake decided not to work in the prescribed manner which caused him no end of trouble.

Steve Austin upheld the name by commeting in the M.G.B., but was troubled by falling poles which detracted from his performance.

This was the first Australian Motorkhana Championship to be held in Queensland, hopefully not the last, as all who entered certainly enjoyed the day competing for the Fremier Award in the Motorkhana Sphere.

COSTS AND CAMS

Nobody will need telling that the administrative costs of CAMS have escalated alarmingly this year. Already the small surplus that had been budgetted for has changed its colour - black to red.

Obviously fees and charges will have to go up, and when you have a look at the figures it seems wrong that they have not gone up before. Ofcourse, capitation rose 100% last year, and we are assured that there will be no further increase in this charge yet which is good. Capitation fees are paid by clubs for each member, regardless whether or not he/she is an active member of the sport. Other charges are borne either by the promoting clubs or by the competitors.

The interesting fact that was established at the last NCC meeting was that all State Councils and most clubs and promotors (including this club) advocated far greater increases than it appears will be made. Unfortunately, the Finance Committee is still deliberating, and it seems that final figures will not be released in time for this issue. When the information is available we'll give you a run down on what the new fees will be a s against what your committee advised.

Meanwhile, here is some information to show how the fee structure hasn't kept up with the times. 1959 - \$21 Club Affiliation 1974 1966 - \$10 1965 - \$ 4 Club Association 1974 \$10 G/C Licence \$ 4 1974 1969 - \$ 2 1967 - 23% \$ 2 R/E Licence 1974 Organising Fee 1974 \$10 1967 - \$10 Permit Open Speed + 1974 1974 Permit Closed Speed + 1967 - \$7.50 1967 - \$ 2 \$7.50 Open Motorkhana 1974 + Not Race meetings

About the only substantial rises have been in closed motorkhanas and touring assemblies. These have gone from "fee waived" to \$2.50 - thereby hitting the people who take least out of the sport, the social competitor at club level. Open Road Event permits have also crept

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slowly up from \$2 in 1966 to \$7.50 in 1974.

We all scream about CAMS slugging us for this and that, but when you look at these figures the surprising thing is that we're viable at all!
