IRON MAN WEEK-END

July 30th saw the start of the annual Iron Man Weekend on abeautiful cool clear night. A field of 34 teams drivers and navigators turning up to do battle.

Off they charged and most went well till the infamous R @ X,HL - here a lot got confused but ther were plenty of places to get back on course. Past the Itchy Palms shop (would have to have a question like that with green fingers Ann setting the run). Off they continued trying to remember how many lefts are there in a roundabout.

After further weaving and into the mudmap it was some drives around Ashgrove and then into the 'all T juret-ions are L @ T unless otherwise stated'. This certainly makes the teams think.

After two runs Alan was in the lead by a few hundredths of a second but on the third run Tony came to the fore and down went Alan. The results being 439.69 to 440.31 ie. .62 second difference. Peter Rayment ended up with the Iron Man title with 417.84 seconds.

The hillclimb saw Mark Trenoweth in the 'E' type Jaguar turn in a shattering 46.2 seconds, first run, to take the FTD with John Davies then turning around and taking the Top Six in the diminutive Robb Kawasaki. (Mark must have been practicing for his run to the hospital with Colleen on the 24th, when their daughter was on her way.)

Even though not many people were mentioned, there were battles right through the field. There is only one problem if you missed out this year - guess what? - you will have to wait till next year to have another go.

ONCE UPON A TIME.....

Once upon a time, many year ago when Tony Sillbeck was Clerk of Course, and Andy Hockley was either a competitor or Assistant Clerk of Course, hillclimbs at Mt. Cotton used to start on time. In those far off days there used to be sufficient officials, Flag Marshalls, Fire Fighters for instance. Would you believe one of each or more per point! There even used to be a Chief Flag Marshall, even at closed hillclimbs, and he used to write a report for the Clerk of Course. Oh, those were the days...

With a club the size of ours it should be possible to get back in part to those days. We must get back to starting on time. We should not just accept late starts as the norm! There must be those of us that were disappointed that the Championships Meeting started 40 minutes late. Then the Iron Man meeting on 1st August started 65 minutes late. Had that meeting started on time, that elusive fourth run would have been possible and we would still have been finished soon after 4 o'clock.

The whole business of late starts is self motivating. We start late one time, the next no one expects it to start on time so they turn up a bit later, the next they say it will start late so why bother trying to be on time, and so on, we just get later and later.

During the last couple of years the one prime cause of lateness has been lack of officials. There are other causes on ocassions such as, dare we say it, one or less stewards, but we are always short of one or less stewards, but we are always short of FLAGGIES. It is just not possible to start a hillclimb without at least one person to wave a flag, use a without at least one person to wave a flag, use a fire extinguisher, or sweep as may be necessary, on each point.

It seems to be generally accepted that around the country Club meetings and things other than open race meetings, start late. You tell someone we will start on time and it is a joke. Mt. Cotton used to be the exception. We used to start on time. We can again. We must.

If you are neither of these but would like to get involved, then come to the hill by 9 o'clock on hillclimb days, be an official, wave a flag.

Just as soon as we have people prepared to help out as flag marshalls, and are at the hill by 9 o'clock we will again be able to show Mt. Cotton Hillclimbs start on time.

P.S. If you find this time very early - so early that you haven't had time for your breaky - then bring it along and have it while you either wait for your turn or view the action....

The National Council has announced its intention to amend the provisions of the regulations as to provide for a 3 litre class in Group A, in lieu of the present 2.5 litre class; and to amend the conditions for the 1983 Australian Sports Car Championship so as to provide for three classes, viz - 1.6 litre, 1.6 litre to 3 litre, and over 3 litre, each class to score points in accordance with the new points scale.

A final decision will not be made until the next meeting of the National Council. Competitors who wish to put a point of view before the Council are asked to write to Head Office as soon as possible.

A number of terms contained in Group D regulations, and for that matter in others, have now heen specifically defined. They will be included in the 1983 Manual. If you want the information before then you can ring Ann Thomson. The terms are; - Chassis, body shell, sills, rocker panels.
