Provisional Licence Holders +++++++++++++++++++++CAMS: CORNER

Recently some of you have missed a days racing because you had not completed enough practice laps. This is not something over which the Clerk of Course or the Stewards have any jurisdiction. The CAMS Manual page 82, section 5.3(c)(ii) is quite definite about it!

The same problems do not arise so frequently at two day meetings, when you probably have two sessions of 20 - 30 minutes for each category. However at one day meetings with only a ten minute session there is no margin for error or accidents. We can only advise you to be sure you are ready when called, to get out of the marshalling area early and to be as sure as

you can that your car is running well.

MG CAR CLUB OF OLD HILICLIMB

23rd JULY 1989

The headline could well have read RECORDS TUMBLE, CARS BURN AND THE LADIES KNITTED ON! For indeed a mild and sunny day at the MG Car Club's Mount Cotton hillclimb circuit on the 23rd made for ideal spectating (and knitting) weather.

After the QLD Championships the previous month where six new records were set, drivers took advantage of near perfect conditions to further lower four class records. Each of the 35 drivers were given six runs each with only one real hold up when Jamie McHugh's Formula Ford buried itself in the nuts and had to be extracted.

In just the second meeting in his new car, John Davies seemed to have Fred Axtell's measure after three runs in the up to 1300cc Racing Cars with a best time of 43.47 seconds. Pulling out all stops and then some, Fred absolutely flung his Axtell Suzuki down the hills to further the class record to 42.81 and answering John's challenge in the process.

1301cc and over Racing Cars saw a battle between John Boyce and Ivan Tighe both driving Kaditchas. David Robertson could not ready his Cheetah in time and so missed the day's competition. John Boyce's 2.0litre car triumphed over Ivan's 1600cc car with consecutive 42.41 second passes on his 4th and 5th runs. Ivan missed the first two runs with engine problems to eventually put down a 42.81 on his final pass.

These rapid little single overhead cam 1600cc racing cars are allowed minimal engine modifications, but with an all up weight of just 480 - 490kg (including driver) this equates to prodigious acceleration. Standing 400metre times of 11 seconds are possible.

Sharing a Ford Anglia, Gary Goulding and Bill Norris thrashed out the up to 2000cc Street Sedans to finish behind eventual class winner Ken Graham's Datsun 1600 in respective F.T.'s of 54.88 and 55.06. Ken's 50.87 second pass on his sixth and final run knocked on the class record door, just a few 10ths of a second off.

A mixture of Commodore Turbos, Toranas, Mazdas and a 3.91 Multi-Point EA Falcon in the 2001cc and over Street Sedans saw Gary Brown's Torana LJ set fastest time in the class in 53.12 seconds. A spectacular under bonnet fire in a competitor's turbo charged Torana in the pits was eventually extinguished but not before some difficulty in opening the obviously scorching hot bonnet. The engine bay was severely damaged but the driver escaped unscathed.

Jamie McHugh had the Formula Ford Class to himself. After an excursion into the Macadamia shells at the hairpin, ex Motorcraft Series Laser driver Jamie posted a creditable 46.56.

The seven week old Gemini record was toppled by Brett Bull on his third run to establish a new record of 53.82 seconds. Sharing the number 10 car Janelle Turvey with Father and Son John and Kevin Heffernan, saw Kevin (with no respect for age and beauty) the quickest of the trio in 54.50.

Slight in stature, glasses and a disarming smile mask an exceedingly quick and clean Appendix J Mini Cooper S driver Brad Stratton. Four runs under the magic 50 second mark lowered yet again the class record to 49.34, prompting many people to wonder just how much faster the boy can go!

Graham Jenkinson had a lonely drive in the up to 2000cc Sports Sedans. 51.28 seconds was Graham's best effort.

That man Barry Wraith did it again by lowering the over 2000cc Sports Sedans class record with 45.57. Trialling a set up of softer springs to aid him off the line, Barry said he would just have to see what it would do for the car. So watching Barry spend more time on three wheels than four came as no surprise. Spectacular Driver Award goes to Trevor Cambell in his Turbo Rotary Mitsubishi Galant. Exiting the second loop, Trevor twice rocked the car up on to two wheels, the second time avoiding going over by backing off the throttle.

Marque Sports Cars saw Bob Marley lookalike Dennis Andrado post a F.T. of 55.62 seconds to finish behind class winner John Broadbent's Triumph Spitfire F.T. of 52.41. Four MGs and a sole Porche 911 filled out the rest of the class.


Peter Rayment's MGTC made a picturesque sight and a most unlikely one though Peter has lapped the Mount enough times to extract the most out of skinny tyres and dated technology (the TC not Peter), to record a creditable 61.39. Peter also took out the best MG up to 1500cc with Mal Spiden winning the over 1500cc in his venerable MGB.

Ivan Tighe finished the quickest in the Top Six shoot out from Fred Axtell, John Davies, John Boyce, Barry Wraith and Jamie McHugh.

Most Improved Driver went to David Reuter driving a Mazda RX7. John Boyce posted F.T.D. (Fastest Time of the Day) in 42.41 seconds.

This writers gratitude and thanks go to his wife who showed great trust and excellent judgement in allowing him to take the Dunnydore around Mount Cotton Hillclimb.





again the race meeting at Lakeside was a huge success for all concerned.

As a maybe, one day racer that participates in the regularity trials, it was most pleasing to see a large field this time.

There were 20 entries for the regularities - certainly a record since I've been around, and after some scrutineering misunderstanding there was a field of 17 starters.

It must be understood that even we regularity people have to ensure that all safety regulations are adhered to. After all, we are still moving fairly quickly.

Unfortunately, we only had one run, but all the competitors had huge grins on the way back to the pits. It certainly is a great way of enjoying oneself without damaging the much loved machinery.

The commentary that accompanied the trial explained the skill required to maintain a regular time over five laps of Lakeside and hopefully helped others to see our interest in this brand of motor sport.

To emphasise this skill, Tony Gould was 0.39 seconds outside his nominated time to get first place - not bad over nearly seven and one quarter minutes. Peter Rayment was a very close second with 0.42 seconds and Peter Smith was third with a difference of 1.0 second.

The competition was fierce as the first seven competitors came in with less than two seconds difference on their nominated times.

The most pleasing aspect was that there were twelve MG's participating, not to say that we don't welcome the "others" but it certainly is nice to see all those G's going round.

Come on folks, the MG's certainly are pretty but they can be a lot of fun too.


